The district encompasses approximately 81 square miles over portions of six townships. The majority of residents live in the towns of Royalton and Hartland, which include the hamlet of Gasport and the Village of Middleport. The district enjoys a rural location only an hour from Buffalo and Rochester, with many farms and small family-owned businesses.

#### **Our District**

The Royalton-Hartland Central School District provides the opportunities for students to excel academically, physically, socially, emotionally, and culturally. The staff creates a safe, educational atmosphere in which each student is provided the opportunity to realize their full potential as students, athletes, artists, musicians, and individuals through personal attention and encouragement. The district has developed a STEAM program and an award winning music program in which students are able to participate from the moment they enter school. Agricultural Education is infused Grades K to 12. The staff continuously develops relationships with every student, developing academic and character education with an emphasis on differentiated instruction.

## **Royalton-Hartland Elementary School**

- Located in Gasport, New York
- Approximately 500 students; grades Pre-K to 4
- Low Student to Teacher ratio
- Educational purpose is to build foundational skills in literacy and math
- Focus on character education
- Active and supportive parent groups

#### **Royalton-Hartland Middle School**

- Located in Middleport, New York
- Approximately 375 students; grades 5 to 8
- Focus on character education
- Numerous clubs and extracurricular activities
- Embraces the true middle school model
- Trust centered environment

# Royalton-Hartland High School

- Located in Middleport, New York
- Approximately 400 students; grades 9 to 12
- Offers 18 dual credit college course offerings
- Partnership with O/N BOCES allows for additional student opportunities in career and technical programs
- Promotes participation, teamwork, and confidence through interscholastic athletic, musical, & extracurricular programs
- Offers a variety of student-leadership opportunities including Future Farmers of America (FFA)







#### **Our Students**

#### The 2019/2020 NYS student report card notes:

- The enrollment of the District was 1,206 students.
- 49% of the students are male and 51% of the students are female.
- 91% of the students are white, 4% Hispanic, 3% multiracial, 1% are black and less than 1% of the students are Asian or Native.
- 43% of the students are considered economically disadvantaged.
- 13% are students with disabilities.
- 1% of our students are considered migrants.
- Less than 1% of our students are considered English Language Learners.
- Less than 1% of our students are in foster care.

#### **STUDENT REPORT CARD DATA:**

In 2019/2020 the New York State Department of Education reported:

- The District is in Good Standing.
- 92% of the students graduated.
- District expenditures per student is \$16,057 -- New York State (\$22,835)
- Three (3) percent of the instructional staff are considered inexperienced -- teaching less than four years. One of the three (3) principals is considered inexperienced -- leading less than four years.
- Two (2) percent of teachers are teaching out of their field of certification -- New York State (9%)

# Royalton-Hartland CSD Strategic Planning Process Executive Summary

During the summer of 2020, the Royalton-Hartland Central School (RHCSD) Board of Education identified the need to develop a long range strategic plan for the District. After much thought and research on the Strategic Planning Process, the Board of Education directed Superintendent Dr. Hank Stopinski to facilitate a process to develop the plan for consideration by the Board of Education. A Board and District goal to complete the strategic planning process was made.

During the fall of 2020, members of the school community including administrators, teachers, support staff, business leaders, service organizations, students and others were encouraged to participate in the process. In November of 2020, the Board of Education appointed a Strategic Planning Committee (SPC) which composed a cross-section of our school community. In December of 2020, a community survey was conducted and the SPC began to work in a virtual environment.

The SPC met approximately every three weeks throughout the winter and spring. In March of 2021, the RHCSD Board of Education approved a revised mission, vision and set of values around the theme of the RAMS Way. The RAMS Way emphasizes that all members of our school community are Respectful, Accountable, Motivated and Successful.

The Board of Education received weekly updates on the progress of the SPC and had presentations made during Board meetings and work sessions specific to the development of the Strategic Plan. In June of 2021, the SPC began to meet in person as they worked to complete the specific goals, objectives, measures and strategies required in the plan. In August of 2021, the SPC presented its final draft of the Strategic Plan to the Board of Education who met in a September work session to review and make final comments to the SPC.

In October of 2021, a public hearing was held by the RHCSD Board of Education and the Strategic Plan received final approval.
