Mr. Bond moved, seconded by Mr. Waters, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent, that the Legal Notice for the Annual District Meeting and Board Member Election on May 19, 2015 be approved as presented.

Mr. Waters moved, seconded by Mrs. Fry, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent, that the donation of a Rockwell drill press valued at \$500.00 from Andrew McKelvey be accepted per Board Policy #5230.

Mr. Koch moved, seconded by Mrs. Hoerner, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent, that a five-year contract extension with STA of New York, Inc. dba Ridge Road Express for transportation services is approved as follows:

2015-16	2.25% or CPI increase, whichever is less
2016-17	2.75% or CPI increase, whichever is less
2017-18	3.25% or CPI increase, whichever is less
2018-19	3.50% or CPI increase, whichever is less
2019-20	3.75% or CPI increase, whichever is less

This is the second extension of an original contract which was awarded in June 2005. Motion carried.

Mr. Bond moved, seconded by Mrs. Hoerner, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent, that the addendum to AIA Document B101-2007 to reflect a total fixed fee of \$85,843 due to additional architectural and engineering costs associated with the state mandated addition to the original scope of work be approved.

Motion carried.

Mr. Bragg moved, seconded by Mr. Bond, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent that the change order #E-2 from Concord Electric Corp. in the amount of \$4,989.00 for costs associated with the following modifications to the contract: install wiremold provided by owner in 52 locations (request by owner) be approved. This change order results in an additional amount of \$4,989.00 for a new contract total of \$532,951.00.

Mr. Bond moved, seconded by Mrs. Hoerner, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent, that the change order #E-3 from Concord Electric Corp. in the amount of \$-357.00 for credits associated with the following modifications to the contract: nine emergency lights not installed (request by owner) be approved. This change order results in an additional amount of \$-357.00 for a new contract total of \$532,594.00.

WHEREAS, in August 2014 the New York State Department of Conservation (NYSDEC) conducted soil sampling tests on the Middleport campus; and

WHEREAS, the NYSDEC presented the results of the soil sampling to the Board of Education on February 4, 2015; and

WHEREAS, the NYSDEC also presented Phase One of a remediation of soil plan with excavation and disposal of soil to be conducted in 2015;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Education hereby authorizes the NYSDEC to conduct Phase One of its remediation of soil plan contingent upon the Board of Education's approval of the work plan associated with this remediation which shall be conducted in 2015.

Discussion:

Mr. Bragg spoke about the fact that the EPA has not been involved in the remediation plan proposed by the DEC but that the SED has; the timeline given by the DEC is too quick; there is still a lawsuit out there between FMC and the DEC.

Mrs. Riegle agreed that no involvement of the EPA is odd; no future capital projects would be approved by the SED if the district chooses not to remediate; the Board does not have a lot of options.

Mr. Waters asked if the State-wide acceptable arsenic level is 7 ppm why is the proposed remediation using 13 ppm; he was not happy with the DEC testing on the Gasport campus.
