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COVID-19 Vaccination Clinic Schedule

The Niagara County Department of Health will be offering FREE COVID-19 vaccine at several sites.

As of November 4, 2021 children ages **5-11** are eligible to receive **Pfizer Vaccine**. **Appointments are REQUIRED** and **ALL children must be accompanied by a parent or guardian**.

Booster doses for Pfizer, J&J and Moderna are available at each location. **Pre-registration is strongly recommended.**

Please use the above links to secure an appointment time. If you are unable to register online, please call 211 at 1-888-696-9211. If you are registering for a booster dose, please have your vaccine card available, you will be asked to confirm your previous vaccination dates.

Second Dose Pfizer Appointments:

All individuals attending a Niagara County DOH clinic, will be auto-registered for the 2nd dose appointment at the same location and same time as the 1st dose unless otherwise directed. Anyone that received a 1st dose at a pharmacy or other clinic should use a registration link to register for an appointment *at least 21 days after the 1st dose*.

Vaccination of Minors:

All individuals **age 5 and older** are eligible to receive a **Pfizer** COVID-19 vaccine. NCDOH recommends that *all* minors be accompanied by a parent or guardian. Providers may accept a COVID-19 Immunization Screening and Consent Form completed by the parent or guardian, where the parent or guardian is not available in person or by phone to provide consent to vaccinate. Look for the form under “Vaccination of Minors Ages 5 – 17 Years” here: www.niagaracounty.com/health/Vaccine Unaccompanied minors should also bring ID/proof of date of birth (birth certificate, passport, learning permit/driver’s license, benefits care, etc.).

Recommendations for Boosters:

There are now booster recommendations for all three available COVID-19 vaccines in the United States. Eligible individuals may choose which vaccine they receive as a booster dose. Some people may have a preference for the vaccine type that they originally received, and others may prefer to get a different booster. CDC’s recommendations now allow for this type of mix and match dosing for booster shots. For individuals who received a **Pfizer-BioNTech** or **Moderna** COVID-19 vaccine, the following groups are eligible for a booster shot at **6 months** or more after their initial series:

- 65 years and older
- Age 18+ who live in [long-term care settings](#)
- Age 18+ who have [underlying medical conditions](#)
- Age 18+ who work or live in [high-risk settings](#)
- Age 18+ who feel they are at risk

For individuals 18+ who received a **Johnson & Johnson** COVID-19 vaccine, a booster shot is recommended **2 months** after the initial dose.
